Rev. Stanley Leung, Senior Pastor

Thank God for leading me to join SCAC again in March this year. This is my 4th time serving in SCAC. Although I have only been away from SCAC for 4 years this time, yet when I first returned, I noticed many changes. There were many new faces from different churches and Hong Kong. Some old members being accustomed to online gatherings during the pandemic, were reluctant to return to in-person worship services. The number of English-speaking congregants has increased, and young generation has grown up. Although SCAC is my mother church, I still felt a little strange when I came back. I realised that I would need to adapt and learn, including memorizing the faces and names of different brothers and sisters! Thank you, brothers and sisters, for bearing and accepting me. While I accepted this position with reverence and trembling, I was also excited that I would experience the abundant grace as I face the challenges ahead.

This year is the year for the church to emerge from the influence of COVID-19. After more than 2 years being impacted by the pandemic, meetings and activities have gradually resumed in person, and brothers and sisters participated with faith and joy. With God's protection we did not experience a large-scale outbreak. Additionally, during the transition of senior pastor, all pastoral staff, leaders, brothers and sisters remained in their posts and continued to work watchfully to help with the smooth transition. This is due to God's grace and the faithful service of all. SCAC is undoubtedly a mature church with different departments, across different age groups, fellowships and congregations where everyone shares the load and cooperates with each other to realize their collective strength. It is such a beautiful picture composed of its many elements such as corporate worship, equipping disciples, preaching the Gospel, and caring for each other through fellowship.

The motto God has given me in ministry over the years is 2 Timothy 2:15, "Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a workman who does not need to be ashamed and who correctly handles the word of truth." As Paul instructed Timothy, I often remind myself not only to teach brothers and sisters with God's words, but also to teach them *correctly*, explaining the truth of the Bible carefully. Not only I can guide brothers and sisters to understand His words, I can also help them how to *correctly* interpret the truth of the Bible. I pray that brothers and sisters will love the word of God and obey His commandments in life so that one can always remain in Him and His love. Helping people to understand God's words has been my burden and task whether in overseas missionary work or local pastoral ministry. I am also reminded of Paul's another charge to Timothy when performing his pastoral duties, as recorded in 2 Timothy 4:2-5 "*Preach the Word*; be prepared in season and out of season; correct, rebuke and encourage – with great patience and careful instruction. For the time will come when men will not put up with sound doctrine. Instead, to suit their own desires, they will gather around them a great number of teachers to say what their itching ears want to hear. They will turn their ears away from the truth and turn aside to myths. But you, keep your head in all situations, endure hardship, do the work of an evangelist, discharge all the duties of your ministry."

During these last days of our Lord Jesus' return, people do not understand the importance of knowing the truth, but they also resist the truth. This is not just a problem when preaching the Gospel outside of the church, it also occurs within the church. Believers are tired of God's words and yearn for the life principles taught in the society and culture, I feel that the pastoral work is getting more challenging, and training my endurance as a pastor. I need to continue to persevere faithfully against resistance and under pressure. To me, shepherding is not mere a job, profession, or as a CEO being accountable to anyone with a performance report, instead I see myself as a servant performing the tasks, and ultimately accountable to the Lord Jesus on how I have fed the sheep entrusted to me by Him. He will assess my service with His piercing eyes, looking beyond the outcomes but also my motives. He is my ultimate judge, so my goal is not the number and statistics, which represents the fruit of quality spiritual lives. My goal is to cultivate and establish the quality of spiritual life of brothers and sisters, so their commitment in following the Lord will be the focus of my ministry.

Reflecting the past, God has raised up many fervent leaders, elders, and pastoral colleagues in SCAC. They have worked hard and sacrificed for the church, leading brothers and sisters to serve using their gifts, perform their duties, build up the body of Christ. SCAC is truly the fruit of everyone's efforts. At the same time, let's not overlook that it is God's grace and care, as the psalmist expressed, "Unless the Lord builds the house, its builders labor in vain." (Psalm 127:1a) If it is not from God, all human efforts will be in vain. Hope that we will not boast but give all glory to Jesus Christ, the Lord of the church. It is He who determines the characteristics and tasks of each local church. The church does not belong to anyone. No one can claim the church as his own. He knows each one of us better than any of us. He determines and controls the role and destiny of each church community!

In the days to come, may we spur each other on the journey of faith, and continue to use the power, the gift and wisdom given by our Lord to face the ever-changing times and zealously preach the Gospel so that more people may know our Lord Jesus! Experiencing changes in our own lives, we will grow spiritually by our participation until the return of our Lord!

2023 saw the English Congregations at both the Main and Gormley Campuses continue to grow and expand its ministries. This year was the 1st full year post-COVID-19 where Sunday services and many of the fellowship and discipleship group gatherings in EM returned to being in person. As in past years, we are blessed to have a strong pastoral and leadership team to oversee the EM congregation. The pastors include myself, Rev. Chris Perumalla and Rev. Jones

Lee (January-June). In November, we welcomed Rev. Rosa Leung as another pastor for the English congregation. We are thankful to have 2 ministry workers this year as well: Jeremy Lo (Main Campus youth & sports) and Jonathan Choy (Gormley youth & EM) as well as an intern, Erica Lam (June-December). This year, we also welcomed 2 new EM elders: Joyce Cheung and Gary Lo as well as 2 "new" EM deacons: Serena Lau and Derek So. It was a blessing to have an expanded team of elders and deacons as this resulted in their presence among our other planning teams involving our young adults. The EM Steering Committee members this year included: Chris Chan (January-August), Cynthia Ho, Jonathan Lau and Gabriel Tse.

The 2023 SCAC theme was "Deeper, Further, Greater". The intention behind this theme was a recognition that as we returned to "life together" as a church post-pandemic, that there was a need for the congregation to 1) "Go Deeper" with Jesus; 2) "Reach Further" for Jesus; and 3) "Expect Greater" of Jesus. As such, one third of the year was spent focusing on each aspect of the church theme: "Deeper" from January to April, "Further" from May to August, and "Greater" from September to December. The sermon series for EM in 2023 continued to be aligned between the Main and Gormley Campuses with Pastor Aaron, Pastor Chris and Jon Choy rotating to preach the majority of Sundays. The sermon series in 2023: DEEPER – "Secrets of the Kingdom: The Parable of the Sower" (February); "Deep Joy: Journey Through Philippians" (March-May); FURTHER – "Lost: Stories of the Father's Love" (June); "Cloud of Witnesses" (July-August); GREATER – "Reset" (September); "Wishful Thinking? The Purpose of Prayer" (October-November); "ReDiscover Christmas" (December).

Worship attendance continued to increase in 2023. At the Gormley Campus, the EM service has been fairly steady at between 50 to 60 on Sundays. At the Main Campus, attendance on some weeks have exceeded 200, prompting the Board of Elders to establish an "EM Space Taskforce" to examine options for facilities usage in order to accommodate the increasing numbers. 2023 also saw the re-launch of what was previously Family Worship Sunday. The service was renamed "BigFam Worship" and the purpose of the service was to encompass everyone in our church family, from the youngest to the most seasoned, to worship God together. The 1st BigFam Worship was held on October 29 at both 9:30am and 11:15am timeslots with 268 attending the 9:30am service and 113 attending 11:15am. This year also saw an increase in the number of baptisms performed within the EM – so much so that a separate service in July and December was needed to be held in order to accommodate the number of baptisms. 4 baptisms were held this year in EM: 3 at Main Campus – April 30 (3 people), July 30 (7 people) & December 24 (9 people) and 1 at Gormley Campus – April 2 (2 people). In total across both campuses, 21 individuals were baptized within EM in 2023. Praise the Lord!

EM's fellowship and small group ministries consisted of 3 main groups this year: Joseph Fellowship (grade 9-12), C3 (university/college, young adult & adult) and the EM Couples Group. Joseph Fellowship began the year meeting on Sundays during the 11:15am timeslot but transitioned back to Friday evenings beginning in September. Jeremy Lo oversaw the fellowship and his report can be referred to for specific activities and highlights from Joseph

this past year. C3 (for "Come, Connect, Cultivate") launched at the end of 2022 but this past year was the 1st full year that the fellowship operated. It was encouraging to see that coming out of the pandemic, there was a desire among our university students, young adults and adults to reconnect together. So while the year began mainly with online gatherings on Zoom, eventually by the end of 2023, the fellowship had returned to in-person large-group gatherings 75% of the time. A positive indication of EM's growth can also be seen in the number of Discipleship Groups (DGs) that operated in 2023. This year saw a total of 8 DGs – 2 university aged, 3 young adult and 3 career groups – for a total of 57 people registered. A C3 Fellowship Committee was established at the end of 2022 to plan and operate the fellowship. The committee members in 2023 included: Clarissa Lau (Chairperson), Chloe Lee, Esther Ching (January–August), Chris Chan (January–August), Ivan Chan and Timmy Cheng. A separate report is submitted for C3 and further details of the fellowship's programming and activities can be found there. As the English Congregation matures, we are also seeing an increasing need to expand the life-stage groups that EM ministers to. For 2023, the EM Couples Group met regularly on the 1st Saturday of each month – breaking for the summer months of June to September. This group was previously joint with couples from the Gormley EM congregation. However for 2023, the group established itself for the Main Campus couples (dating, engaged or married) which included over 12 couples. Another need arising from within the group was the need for childcare during the couples group gatherings. We were grateful for the Joseph Fellowship students who volunteered to babysit during the various months: Beatrice, Kaylie, Odelia, Olivier, Simon, Tiffany and Vicky. While not a "fellowship", one other group that met consistently were those who attended the weekly Wednesday evening EM prayer meetings. For 2023, EM prayer meetings were joint between the 2 campuses and gathered online on Zoom. The prayer meeting consistently saw 15 or more each week gathering together to pray for the needs of the English congregation at both sites.

Evangelism, Missions and Outreach initiatives in 2023 included highlights such as: the commissioning of one of our own within EM to full-time overseas work in January; an Outreach event at Gormley: "Fanning the Flame of Faith" with special speaker, Krish Dhanam; 2023 Good Friday service joint between 5 Chinese Alliance English congregations with speaker Krish Dhanam; TAC community service (May 27); Participation in outreach activities at Woodside Square Mall (June 17); Evangelism training with special speaker Vince Vitale: "Communicating Christ Through Today's Cultural Challenges" (June 24); Outreach Sunday services at both campuses with Vince Vitale: "The Gift of Repentance" (June 25); SCAC Missions Conference (October 20-22) and the Gormley Christmas Carol Outreach Service (December 2). In addition to the above special events, our weekly EM Rec Night continued at the main campus every Wednesday evening. This year saw attendance usually over 30+ and with many coming from outside of the church. This ministry was developed by EM leadership to establish a pathway for those attending the Rec Night to then be integrated into other EM programming, fellowship (C3) and discipleship groups. Sports ministry also included both a junior and senior softball team – please refer to Jeremy Lo's report for more details.

It has been a tremendous privilege and blessing to be part of what God is doing and continues to do in our midst in the English Ministry at SCAC. As the new year begins, we continue to strive that all who join us will experience a transformed life as we encounter Jesus together. May all glory, praise and honour be to God and to Him alone!

"The Book of James" and "Proverbs" are both very practical books; "James" is also known as the Proverbs in the New Testament. I am very grateful for the opportunity to teach for the Mandarin congregation and to learn from each other through teaching.

Prayer Ministry: Thanks to those who have served alongside in the ministry: Landy Luo, Catherine Yung, Derek So, Corie Tse, Sabrina Cheng, Pullisa So, and Clara Lee.

"Going Deeper, Reaching Further, Expecting Greater" was held on January 1. It was a joint event with the Main Campus, Gormley Campus, English Ministry, and Mandarin Ministry.

On April 8, Fasting Prayer Meeting used this year's church theme to pray for the new senior pastor and the new leadership team; 153 people attended. On November 18, "Find strength in peace and stability" was the 1st in-person fasting prayer meeting after the pandemic, with 92 attendees. Starting in July, Wednesday prayer meetings began to have in-person gatherings. We conducted it in a hybrid format during the transition period. Thanks to those who provided technical support for us and allowed the prayer meeting to proceed smoothly.

This year, pastoral staff and elders continue to pray for people in need after every 1st Sunday Service of the month. It allowed us to follow up and care for their personal and spiritual needs. This year, Rev. Kim Poon also shared in the Mandarin prayer meeting occasionally.

This year, healing prayer meetings were held in March, July, and October. The testimonies and sharing demonstrated God's love and grace, with 135, 112, and 99 people attending respectively.

At the year-end Thanksgiving prayer meeting on December 27, brothers and sisters witnessed God's amazing works, with 186 people attending. I am very grateful for the technology and online support behind the prayer meeting, including Elder Tommy Yuen, Elder

Landy Luo, and Kin Woo. May the Lord grant us the grace to make the church a house of prayer for all nations.

During the Prayer Sunday Service, Rev. Stanley Leung preached "Prayer that Transforms the Heart" on September 3 to encourage brothers and sisters to build spiritual lives through prayer according to the teachings of the Bible. From May to June this year, we embarked on a "Forty-day Prayer Journey". Daily prayer items can be viewed on the church's website, and more than 150 print booklets were distributed.

The "Deeper Life and Mission Training" Ministry: The 4th module was conducted in June, with 47 participants; (13 of them were facilitators). Scripture Prayer exercises were held in the morning and evening from April 6 to May 4 (Spring) and October 5 to November 3 (Autumn). The instructors were Rev. Samuel Or, Rev. Kim Poon, Pastor Vanessa Lo, Polly Hui, Catherine Yung, and Derek So. Thanks to Catherine Yung for her leadership and coordination.

Health Education Committee: Rev. Kim Poon, Agnes Lam, Marine Tong, Rosalie Cheng, Candy Lee, Sam Kwan, Justin Hung. "Exploring the Mental Health of Children and Adolescents from a Growth Perspective" was held on March 24. Dr. Leung, a registered Social Worker in Hong Kong and a lecturer in the Department of Applied Social Sciences of the Hong Kong Polytechnic University, delivered the workshop. 80 people attended. The "Passport to Purity" (P2P) day camp was held on September 23-24 for students in grades six to eight and their parents, with 28 families and 56 people participating.

Nehemiah Fellowship Retreat on July 1-3: The retreat's theme was "Going Deeper, Reaching Further, Expecting Greater". Thanks to the invitation from the fellowship, that allowed me to share the messages and spend time with brothers and sisters in the fellowship.

Esther Fellowship (Please refer to the fellowship report for more details): This year, Rev. Kim Poon and Pastor Vanessa Lo led the study of "The Book of Job", Ronnie Wong's "Holy Land Bible Study Tour", Rev. Daniel Wong's "The Numbers", Serena Lau shared worship special topics, Pastor Chan's couple shared "South Asian Religions", Pastor Percy Ho shared "Abraham's Life", and in-person gatherings resumed from April to November. **Zion Fellowship** (Please refer to the fellowship report for more details): Brothers and sisters lead Bible studies monthly and pray for pastors and international workers regularly. Thanks to the committee members for their faithful serving!

Cornerstone Fellowship (Please refer to the fellowship report for more details): The theme of this year is "Deeper Life". Rev. Kim Poon and Rev. Albert Chu shared topics on deeper life in the big group gatherings as well as shared and cared for individual care groups.

YASAD (Please refer to the committee report for more details): The ministry is to serve families with children with special needs. In-person gatherings resumed in July this year. Community resources, inspirational testimonies, and prayers for each other were shared at the gatherings. Introduction to resources and supported employment services was held in April. In August, a half-day trip to Markham Forest Trail Park was arranged with Agape Sisters Fellowship.

Elisha Fellowship (please refer to the fellowship report for more details): The fellowship focused on caring for those in need and encouraging more young families to become prayer warriors.

This year, the fellowship had more group leaders and new members. Also, we had 2 more

pastors, Rev. Jones Lee and Pastor Percy Ho. The Family Fellowship expected to continuously follow the footsteps of the Lord, run for the Lord, spread its wings and soar.

Elim Fellowship

Thank God! In the past year, the ELM group developed steadily in all aspects. After resuming in-person meetings at the beginning of the year, the attendance has been steady. In January, Mr. Paul Wan-hoi Cheung, the associate professor of Alliance Bible Seminary, gave a lecture on the Book of Revelation. Thanks to the Lord for the abundant provision of spiritual food. - 3. The return of preschool class, with both the wonderful leaders to facilitate the class, and the children who have graduated up from the nursery to form that class.
- 4. New leaders are in key ministry positions. I am thankful for all of our previous leaders, and in particular, very thankful for all our leaders who rode the pandemic with us over what has become the last few calendar years.
- 5. Special appreciation goes to our 2023 Summer Intern team, who endeavored hard in planning, coordinating and executing our summer camps and VBS this year. May the Lord bless them as they have been a blessing to the children at our camps.
- 6. We have managed to nuance and nail down our goals for facilitating BigFamWorship. We thank our partners in the English Ministry for their partnership and support.
- 7. We thank our church family for supporting us on specific endeavors, such as CM Sunday, and also allowing us to deploy a recess zone, although at a slight inconvenience to those who normally may need to use the North Elevator

This year, in particular, has been fruitful as a ministry, and with the support of our ministry workers, to finally have much of our foundational elements in place for ministry so that as a ministry team we can begin again to look forward and to plan and to discern the future of CM here at SCAC. I am thankful to have served alongside our four CM Elders, Raymond Lo (Chair), Sam Kwan, Joyce Hui and Gary Lo, and our 2 CM Administrative Staff, Janet Chow and Priscilla Chien. - 1. Our demographic has shifted significantly with the arrival of our brothers and sisters in Hong Kong. There is not only a language barrier at times, but also a cultural barrier.
- 2. While we are thankful for all the new CM ministry workers who have joined us in 2023, as we continue to resume and even begin more areas of ministry, we find ourselves still short on CM leaders, particularly in teaching roles, for children's worship and children's Sunday school.
- 3. We inevitably have arrived back at one of our biggest pre-pandemic problems: space. As many ministries that have gone virtual during the pandemic have returned to in-person gatherings, the reality continues to be that we are outgrowing our space (we recognize this is not just in CM, but as SCAC overall).
- 4. While we are physically back for CM, we are still dealing with many of the casualties of the pandemic, ranging from the social skills of our children to some of the spiritual disciplines that they would have established and maintained from in-person gatherings.

Whether highlights or challenges, these are things that I recognize and continue to submit to God, as we each try to tackle the tasks He calls us to do for His Kingdom and for His children to come to know Him as their Lord and Saviour. May the Lord continue to call upon our brothers and sisters to serve our children and our families here at SCAC, so that they will know that this is a safe community for them. Amen.

The Arrangement of Place and People: Foyer and Old Overseas Chinese

After being recognized by the church at the beginning of the year, I continued the pastoral work among the Cantonese-speaking young people. Thanks to the foresight of the building planning committee, SCAC can have a cyber feel foyer that can accommodate more than 60 young people to congregate. I would also like to thank the elders of the church for their love for the young people. In the New Year, Michael Lam, Yvonne Chiu and Luke Tong joined the ministry team. With the additional team members, along with more aunts and uncles to help with transporting the young people to participate in fellowship activities at church, allowed this group of newcomers to be cared by the "old overseas Chinese". Space and manpower are critical for the development of this ministry.

Since these young people have no family or friends in Toronto, church is their gathering place. Centennial College and University of Toronto Scarborough Campus are close to SCAC, allowing "Stream A" young people to bring their friends and roommates they met in school to the church. The young people in "Stream B" are brought by friends of SCAC's brothers and sisters. Many thanks to brothers and sisters who trust me! Young people enjoy forming relationships with church friends, who have a different temperament than others. Relationship Evangelism and Life Impacting Life is our method of preaching. Developing and equipping believers are my areas of focus.

Nurturing believers: Spiritual Discipline, Music and Bible Study

In the 1st half of the year, I studied Spirituality for Generation Z, the last subject for fulfilling my ThM. Heavenly Father allowed me to combine knowledge and service as I work with Gen Z who came from Hong Kong. In the unique situation of the times, conversing with Henri Nouwen, a spiritual master who has been my subject of study helped me finish the most beautiful assignment before graduation and a valuable conclusion. In the past 3 years, I have brought the study of spiritual disciplines into staff meetings, life building, retreats, prayer meetings and Sunday school, applying what I have learned.

Thanks to the Heavenly Father for bringing believers with different talents to serve among us, including those with different musical talents so that I can lead worship service. I led Daniel Worship Team using different instruments to worship God in February!

On the other hand, I also encourage each believer to take on one position; establish spiritual disciplines and skills in a close team service relationship. Bible pilot, in the pre-study is an in-depth discussion of scripture. The core believers in each group establish a Core and learn to serve and pray together. At year end, a spiritual group was established in the North York area in the form of a small group, hoping to establish spiritual friendship among young sisters.

Grounded

When I found out in mid-June that my work visa had not been issued and all work had to be stopped immediately, I felt like a plane taxiing on the runway, getting ready to take off, suddenly had to stop. I felt bad because many summer activities were just about to be carried out. Fortunately, my colleagues around me supported me. Thanks to Pastor Percy Ho, Elder Sam Kwan, Joyce Hui, Grace Kwong, Yvonne Chiu and Luke Tong who immediately took over my duties.

After being grounded, I participated as a lay-person and sat among the brothers and sisters worshipping together. This is an opportunity I never had. To get to know other churches' youth (Hong Kong) ministries and interview their pastoral staffs and reflect on how to build my field in the context of my own church.

During this period, God asked me to constantly reflect on the meaning of service. In fact, I have started serving since I entered the church in middle school. Shortly after graduating from college, I became a full-time pastor. After the Sabbatical Year and finishing ThM, the government suddenly asked me to stop working. I was really confused. Since I need to learn not to see myself as an earthly person, I should walk through my journey as a daughter of Heavenly Father and listen to what He wants me to do every day. I also gradually discovered

that different friends around me also had similar experiences and we had to learn from each other.

Thanks to the prayers and support of my brothers and sisters. I was able to renew my work visa before the end of the year and returned to my ministry position! Let me fly again!

Pastor Percy Ho, Assistant Pastor

Thank the Lord! At the beginning of this year, I changed my status from elder and mentor to lay pastor. Starting in September, God led me officially serve in SCAC as an assistant pastor. It has been about 30 years since I came to SCAC. Daniel Fellowship

I have been serving in the "Overseas Student Ministry". With Canada's open immigration policy Stream A & B for young people, a large number of Hong Kong young people came to Toronto alone and applied to become permanent residents in Canada. As a result, we have witnessed rapid growth in the Daniel Fellowship. For details, please read the "2023 Overseas Student Ministry" and "Daniel Fellowship" reports.

Once again, I would like to thank Elder Sam Kwan and Pastor Wendy Kong for their cooperation and teaching. In pastoral care, I am responsible for 2 projects. The first is "meals", which is modeled on the warm home meals of South China Fellowship on Tuesdays. Every Friday, many thanks to Lolita and with the help of Leo and the participation of some young people from Hong Kong, at 6:30pm, the meals would be ready for the young people after work and school to come to SCAC to enjoy, followed by the weekly fellowship meeting. The second is "discipleship". Twice a month after the 9:30am worship service, we invite young people who are from Hong Kong and have already believed in the Lord to pursue a deeper understanding of the Bible and faith life; an average of more than 20 people attend each session. When people attend, we discuss with them the difficulties, doubts and struggles of faith in an interactive and inspiring way. The goal is to enable them to mature spiritually and bear witness for the Lord.

Family Fellowship

In addition to young people, another group that I need to learn to shepherd is Family Fellowship. Together with 3 pastors, we care for, support the group leaders, and care about the work of the group members.

Follow-up Ministry

With church reopened after the pandemic and the arrival of new immigrants from Hong Kong, we need to re-plan how to effectively carry out follow-up at SCAC.

Other ministries

Sunday school discipleship, Bible studies classes, and weekly preparation meetings enhance one's understanding of God's words. This year, I taught several Old Testament characters, including Joshua, Abraham, and David. Through the preparation for each lesson, I can gain deeper understanding of the Bible. In addition, I also have the new opportunities in preaching in Sunday worship and sharing Gospel messages in fellowships. As a preacher, I really have many things to learn. Pray that the Lord will continue to guide and help me!



English Ministry Gary Lo

The English Ministry (EM) at SCAC ministers to the predominantly English-speaking people group, composed of youths from grade 7 and up, and adults of all ages (18+), across both the Main Campus and Gormley Campus.

In support of this year's theme of "Deeper, Further, Greater", our wonderful pastoral team at EM (Rev. Aaron Owen, Rev. Chris Perumalla, Jonathan Choy) delivered God's word through several well thought out and impactful sermon series. "Come, Connect, Cultivate" - the 3 pillars of C3 Fellowship. C3 Fellowship officially launched in January 2023, with a total of 8 discipleship groups (DG) and serving over 50 university, young adults, and adults in SCAC English Ministry.

Our committee consisted of members from EM including Chloe Lee, Clarissa Lau, Ivan Chan, and Timmy Cheng. Our pastoral and elder/deacon team included: Pastor Aaron, Elder Gary Lo, Elder Joyce Hui, and Deacon Derek So.

We started the year by focusing our Biblical study in the Book of Philippians – a book that focused on the cost of discipleship and sacrifice. We wanted to explore what sacrificial living looked like and in the Book of Philippians, Paul responds that we can live joyfully and sacrificially. Each DG took time to reflect and consider how the lessons in Philippians would apply to their own lives.



In May, we began to hold more in-person fellowship events such as Bible studies, social gatherings, and prayer meetings. We had great turnout to each event and welcomed many new faces to our community.

In the summer, the C3 men explored the great outdoors by fishing (courtesy of Pastor Aaron) and bonded over their brotherhood. The C3 ladies bonded over a message led by our EM intern, Erica Lam and got to enjoy some good food and crafts.

Some of the highlights of our fellowship included: Chinese New Year celebration, bowling, Christmas shoebox packing, and Christmas potluck.

In December, the SCAC Board of Elders officially accepted the request for C3 to formally become a SCAC fellowship.

Children's Ministry Raymond Lo

After more than 2 years of online gatherings, new immigrant families have gradually become involved, bringing about some new changes. Missions

Family Worship

This year, whenever there is a 5th week in a month, we encourage parents to worship together with their children. The worship is primarily conducted in English, as we collaborate with the English Ministry to help children better understand and learn about worship. This involves a lot of coordination and planning, and we are grateful for the leadership of Pastor Aaron and Pastor Stephen in this endeavor. Due to space constraints, we are attempting to have 2 separate worship sessions to ensure that the limited space does not impact the worship experience. We are continuously exploring and refining the arrangements for family worship, aiming to enhance children's engagement and facilitate their understanding and growth in faith.

Children's Ministry Retreat

We haven't organized an in-person Children's Ministry retreat for several years. This year, on May 6, we invited Rev. Rosa Leung as our speaker, with the theme "Being Christ's Body's Builders". We not only enjoyed the beautiful weather and a delicious BBQ lunch that day, but also had the opportunity for brothers and sisters to share and exchange thoughts. Most importantly, we received spiritual nourishment from the pastor.

Plan to Protect

Every adult serving children within the church is required to take the "Plan to Protect" (PTP) course. This year, we certified approximately 180 adult volunteers from various ministries, serving in the Main and Gormley Campuses. Special thanks to Pastor Stephen for facilitating this course.

Preschool Class

The preschool class is designed for children aged 2.5 to 4 years old. This year, we were only able to conduct the 9:30 am preschool worship due to a shortage of manpower, and unfortunately, we couldn't organize the 11:15 am preschool Sunday school. We pray for the Lord to lead more brothers and sisters to participate in this ministry. Wenda Tam is the contact person, and the serving sisters include Tina Wong, Cathy Zhou, Angela Tam, and Amy Hui. Thank you to the caring aunties for their service to our little children!

Children's Worship

Children's worship is intended for junior kindergarten to second-grade students. Teachers and co-workers are divided into 2 groups, taking turns to lead for a season. The contact persons for each group are Catherine Yung and Sylvie Tsui. The brothers and sisters involved in serving include Nancy Koo, Linda Tang, Esther Chu, Elsie Yuen, Donald Lai, and Alison Yan. We appreciate all the worship leaders who have taken on responsibilities in this regard!

Children's Sunday School

Since September, Children's Sunday school has been moved from every week at 10:15 to 10:55 to the 1st and 3rd Sundays of each month from 11:30 to 12:30 this year. We aim to

provide teachers and children with more time to interact, fostering relationships that aid in the growth and learning of the children.

Starting in September, due to the 9:30 am Children's Worship preceding the Sunday school until its conclusion at 12:30, children need some time to rest. Therefore, we have set up a 15-minute break during which children can play board games within the Sheep Pen area or, under supervision, stretch in the corridor. 6 volunteers take turns serving each week during this time: Jeff Chow, David Au, Tommy Ma, Jon Lau, Kevin Chan, and Samuel Soon.

Teacher and Parent Orientation Day: In September, at the beginning of the new school year, we revamped our traditional approach for the orientation day. In addition to introducing new changes for the school year, teachers, and the assistant team, we also allocated time for parents and the teacher team to interact. We distributed parent handbooks to help parents understand the expectations of the Children's Ministry, aligning with our mission statement to collaborate with families in building the next generation.

Gospel Project@Home: Apart from Sunday morning worship and Sunday school, we encourage children to continue reading God's word at home. We have introduced a reward program called "Gospel Project@Home". If a child completes the scriptures they need to read for a month, there are rewards to encourage the desire for reading God's word. For younger children, we hope parents can assist them in reading at home to cultivate a habit of reading the Bible together.

AWANA Children Fellowship Sampson Kwan

AWANA's Children Fellowship continues to thrive, held on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of each month from 11:15 am to 12:30 pm. Under the dedicated leadership of Raymond Ho as the AWANA T&T Director for Grade 3 to Grade 6 students, and Alison Yung as the AWANA Sparks Coordinator for SK to Grade 2, our program is flourishing. Elder Sam Kwan serves as the Commander, overseeing 29 adult volunteers. The attendance varies from 54 to 91, with an average of 69 students.



Children's Ministry

In line with the previous year's policy, AWANA maintains a registration-free approach. To strengthen students' connection to the program, there were discussions about reintroducing the AWANA uniform requirement. However, considering cost concerns, the decision was made to defer this reintroduction. Instead, children completing the initial AWANA assignment will receive a complimentary special bag to showcase their awards and badges, fostering a sense of achievement and participation.

In a bid to align with Sunday school curriculum and enhance the connection with Sunday worship messages, Pastor Stephen and Elder Sam have adopted the Gospel Project material. They alternate teaching during AWANA Big Group/Council Time, ensuring a seamless flow of spiritual growth for our students.

As part of AWANA's broader mission to "reach boys and girls with the Gospel of Christ" and to train youth to serve God by serving others, the Leader-In-Training (LIT) program was reinstated after a hiatus due to the COVID-19 pandemic. In November, we successfully recruited 13 youths for the LIT role. Following a brief leadership training and orientation with Elder Sam, each youth was assigned to serve in Game Team, T&T, or Sparks. Regular monthly meetings with Sam will monitor their progress, with the aspiration to nurture these youths into devoted disciples of Christ.

Looking ahead, we fervently pray for the emergence of a suitable individual to fill the vacant Sparks Director role. May the Lord grant our team the wisdom and guidance to continue sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ with the children in AWANA throughout the coming year.

Our collective hope and prayer are that AWANA remains a place of spiritual growth, community, and service for the children we are blessed to serve.

Children and Youth Ministry (Gormley Campus)

When I think about 2023, I think about emerging out of the pandemic and resuming a lot of our normal activities as a church. God has blessed us with many young families at Gormley, mostly from Hong Kong.

AWANA finished their 1st year of running it at Gormley. We started AWANA in our 1st year with about 10-15 kids and since September, our numbers were close to 20-30 kids.

Gormley Campus Ministry

In September, we made a significant shift in our Children's Ministry (CM) scheduling and rather than offering AWANA every week, we now offer it 2-3 times a month. In the other weeks, we have "Extended Sunday School" where the teachers in the CM worship will continue teaching the lesson.

The YA Saturday fellowship's children program has grown in numbers in 2023. From 10-12 kids, we now have over 25 kids that come to the fellowship every month.

From July 31-August 4, we ran our first ever Scripture Union Sports Camp for 6–12-yearolds. Although we were small in number, it was a great success and the kids that attended really enjoyed themselves. 3 kids and 1 leader came to accept Jesus as their saviour at this camp.

In August 21-25, we ran our 4th annual Youth Leadership Camp at Gormley Campus.

For the youth, our youth counselor team is expanding to welcome Jacky as a graduate intern to the Gormley pastoral team at the beginning of 2023 to help with the Chinese speaking youth. Jacky has also started a basketball skills training time in a nearby gym in November, on every Monday nights with 15 youth attending per term.

On Sundays, the Youth Ministry is approximately 20-25 youth and steadily growing. We are also thankful that in August and September 2023, 8-10 teens came to know Jesus as their saviour and are being followed up and discipled by Jacky over Zoom.

Towards the end of 2023, there is a need to start a preschool ministry for the English Ministry (EM) parents as many families are coming to EM with young children under 5 years of age so a nursery team has been assembled to meet this need.

Overall, I am thankful for the steady growth of both the Children and Youth Ministry in both congregations at Gormley! Praise God for his wonderful works in our next generation!

English Ministry (Gormley Campus) Jonathan Choy

By God's grace, this past year the English Ministry (EM) at Gormley Campus has continued to grow and flourish under the leadership of Rev. Aaron Owen, Rev. Chris Perumalla, Deacon Serena Lau, and Jonathan Choy. Not only has our Sunday worship continued in an increase of consistency of attendance with about 50 to 60 members meeting weekly, many other ministries have been started and expanded. The community's passion for hospitality and fellowship grew to spawn 2 new ministries. Here is the report for Welcome Ministry of Mandarin congregation from March to November 2023 (a total of 9 months):

- There are a total of 38 new guests:
 12 of whom regularly attend worship services;
 2 of them have joined the Youth Fellowship;
 1 of them joins a sister group;
 1 of them joins the Joy & Blessing group,
 and a couple joins the Couples group.
 Among the 38 new guests,
 16 are nonbelievers,
 5 of them attend worship and Sunday school regularly,
 and the remaining 11 are unable to continue for various reasons (3 have to work on Sundays; 4 live far away from church; 1 temporarily returns to China; 2 are not interested and the last one is elderly who has health issues).
 - Among the 38 new guests, the reasons for believers who did not continue to participate in the gatherings: visitors and graduated seminary students, living far away or working on Sundays.

Prayer Ministry Landy Luo

Paul teaches us in Ephesians 6:11-17 to put on the full armour of God to face spiritual battles. This includes the belt of truth buckled around your waist, using the breastplate of righteousness in place, wearing the Gospel of peace, taking up the shield of faith, taking the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit. Why do we put on the full armour? Certainly, it is for spiritual warfare. How do we engage in this battle? In Ephesians 6:18, Paul continues to say, *"Pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests."* With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the Lord's people. Putting on the full armour of God alone is not enough; we must pray. Praying alone is not enough; we must put on the full armour. The two are inseparable.

Furthermore, we organize various special prayer meetings, such as "Fasting Prayer Meeting", "Prayer Summit", "Pastors' Prayer Time" and "40 Days Prayer Journey", providing more platforms for church-wide prayer for pastors as well as brothers and sisters. Through these practices, we engage in praying in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests, seeking God's guidance at all times.

Wednesday Prayer Meeting

In 2023, as ministries gradually return to normal after the pandemic, the Wednesday evening prayer meeting is also exploring appropriate ways to adapt to changes. The prayer meeting resumed in a hybrid format in July, combining both in-person and online modes, while continuously evaluating the suitability of this new mode.

40 Days Prayer Journey (May)

Continuing from the previous year, we compiled the "40 Days Prayer Journey" booklet, praying for pastors, their families, ministries, mission fields, specific groups, and Canada. This year, the booklet was themed "Renewed Strength, Soar on Wings" guiding brothers and sisters to pray faithfully for the same topics on the same day. Thanks to Catherine and Janet for collecting data, designing, and compiling this beautiful prayer booklet. Special thanks to Elder Eric, Pullisa and Raymond for their translation as well as editing work.

Scripture Prayer & Meditation (April, October)

In 2 periods from April 6 to May 4 and October 5 to November 2, led by the lead pastor, we conducted 30-minute scripture prayer and meditation on Thursday mornings and evenings for 5 consecutive weeks. The purpose was to guide brothers and sisters through the 4 steps of lectio, meditatio, oratio, and contemplatio, deepening their reflection on the Scriptures and engaging in dialogue with God. In this process, participants bring their personal feelings, thoughts, and needs before God, expressing their response to the Scriptures and seeking guidance and revelation from God. The attendance this year is higher than in previous years, with an average of 41 (daytime) and 48 (evening) in April, and an average of 22 (daytime) and 24 (evening) in October. Deeper Life & Mission Training (June)

Cantonese Student Outreach Ministry Sampson Kwan

The Cantonese Student Outreach Ministry at SCAC caters to the Cantonese-speaking youth group, consisting of the Jesus-Teens Fellowship, which ministers to high school-aged youth (grades 8-12), and the Daniel Fellowship, which serves college/university-aged young adults. The ministry's overarching goal is to reach seekers with the Gospel of Christ and to nurture young Christians into disciples of Christ.

In 2023, SCAC actively welcomed newcomers and families from Hong Kong. Consequently, the Cantonese Student Outreach Ministry experienced a corresponding increase in the number of participants in our respective fellowships. The Jesus-Teens Fellowship meets at 11:15 am on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of each month, with an average of 11 participants. Despite a brief interruption during the summer due to Pastor Wendy Kong's work permit application issue, we are grateful for Deacon Grace Kwong and Elder Joyce Hui's interim leadership in guiding the fellowship. The Jesus-Teens Fellowship resumed regular meetings in November when Pastor Wendy received her work permit.

Traditionally, the Daniel Fellowship exclusively served college and university students. However, with the influx of newcomers through the Stream A/B immigration scheme, we observed changes in the fellowship members' demographics. Currently, Daniel Fellowship members' ages range from grade 12 students to career young adults, and the average attendance has grown from 30-plus in 2022 to 50-70 participants each week in 2023. The number of small groups has expanded from 3 to 5 groups, and considering the size of each small group, we anticipate more small groups spinning off from the current ones. Ministering to such a diverse group of fellowship members would have been an impossible task without the Lord's providence. We are thankful to see many brothers and sisters moved by the Lord to join our ranks in the Daniel Fellowship, making it a welcoming place for seekers and believers alike. Please refer to the Daniel Fellowship report for the names of all the brothers and sisters and their various roles within the fellowship.

As mentioned earlier, we thank the Lord for guiding Pastor Wendy Kong through her work permit application process. Additionally, we celebrate the Lord's calling for Pastor Percy Ho to transition from his ministry elder role to become a full-time pastor in June 2023. We pray that the Lord continues to guide us and grants our serving team the spirit of unity and discernment as we plan for the ministry's direction in 2024.

".....*As the Father has sent me, I am sending you.*" (John 20:21)

We can understand this verse to read: "As the Father sent me, so also in the same way I am sending you." The Father loved and listened to the Son. The Son loved and watched for what the Father initiated. Jesus, in dynamic nearness to the Father, continued what God had been doing throughout history. Jesus sends us in this same way. The verse also means: "As the Father sent me, so also you are sent to accomplish the same historic purpose for which I was sent." This is more than mind-boggling. Jesus entrusted ordinary people with the same enormous matters which the father entrusted to Him..." (extracted from Perspectives on the World Christian Movement).

"Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." (Matthew 28:19-20)

Jesus entrusted this enormous task of making disciples of all the people groups to us. Church has the responsibilities to train and equip believers. And believers have the responsibilities to be trained and equipped, so that they can complete the task that Jesus entrusted us. For this reason, Mission Department held many activities throughout the year. Below is a brief summary of our ministries.

A. Mission Moment and Newsletter – Amy Au

We have Mission Moment in all Sunday services on every 3rd Sunday. This is a good opportunity to introduce new International Workers (IWs) and to provide an update of the mission work of our denomination and our IWs around the world. We are thankful for those IWs who made special efforts in making the video clips for Mission Moment, so that brothers and sisters could see and hear directly from IWs about the field. The video clips are posted on SCAC YouTube Channel for those who missed watching them. Many thanks go to brothers and sisters who supported in the background, including subtitles preparation, voice over and video editing.

Mission Committee regularly receives IW newsletters providing an update of their work and prayer needs. We share some of them in Mission Newsletter, which is included in church bulletin once every two months. Brothers and sisters, who want to receive these IW newsletters and pray for them regularly, could contact Mission Committee.

B. Short Team Mission - Tranal Chow

1. STM Team: Madagascar Dental + Team STM Date: June 8 - 21, 2023 Team tasks:

- Provide dental services to local needy people.
- 4 Assist the post-op team in wound dressing and visitations.
- Hold ESL conversation groups.
- Provide essential building maintenance.
- Set up library labelling systems.

Our team includes 5 old and 3 new members: Ada Kwan, Alan Ching, Amy Lam, Bonnie Yung, Carol Pang, Debbie Wu, Howard Tang, Iris Lam.

Our team was able to carry out all the tasks as planned. Many students and patients came to church for the first time through the services we provided and most of them were nonbelievers. The church took the opportunity to provide follow-up and share the Gospel with them. May God establish the work of our hands and the newcomers will come to know God.

All our team members treasured the opportunity to be a part of this mission. Our new members were touched by the work of God whereas our old members gave praises to it repeatedly. We were all thankful that we could be a part of it even though our part was very small.

2. STM Team: Madagascar English Team

STM Date: September 9 – 24, 2023

The Madagascar short term mission team includes a team of 6 including Tammy Kwan, Donald Lai, Karen Leung, Hugo Mak, Carol Pang and Teddy Tse. The mission is a partnership with the Christian and Missionary Alliance Church in the capital, Antananarivo. The objectives include organizing:

- English language camps
- 🖕 Job skills classes
- Personal development seminars
- Ministry skill workshops

Being one of the poorest countries in the world, Madagascar does not provide enough jobs. Young people are eager to learn any skills that would land them a decent job. Knowing an international language and practical job skills can significantly improve their job prospects. Thus, we ran English camps to teach everyday English and classes on resume writing, Microsoft Office and the craft of making greeting cards. Many young Malagasy also are not prepared to face life challenges. To meet this need, we organized seminars on stress management, money management and communication skills. For the youthful Christians serving in the church, we shared our experience in music and worship. In total we reached about 90 attendees through these engagements.



We believe that helping the needy people with their physical needs is an essential part of bringing God's love to the Malagasy people. Yet, we do not forget that bringing the people to God Himself provides the ultimate salvation from man's turmoil. Through our services, many people stepped into the church for the first time and the church is ready to welcome and help them to come to Christ.

C. Mission Fellowship Program – Francis Lee

Mission Committee was delighted to roll out a mission fellowship program, "The Unreached People Groups." This program aims to encourage brothers and sisters to work hand in hand, heart to heart supporting and working with our international workers in reaching out the Unreached People Groups.

D. Mission Conference – Victor Tam

The Mission Conference was held from October 20 to 22 this year. The theme was "GO YE, and make disciples of all nations". Missionaries need teammates and comprehensive support to help them fulfill their mission. What role do you play in the mission field? The keynote speaker was Dr. Ace Cheung, who has been a missionary in West Africa for 16 years. The Children's Mission Conference speakers were Glen & Ivy Milanowski, who have returned from the Netherlands. In addition to speaker sessions and worship, the program also included 2 consecutive evenings of missionary dramas, Asian cuisine, and a missionary banquet. Thanks be to the Lord, this year's attendance set a record for the past decade, with nearly 400 attendees each evening. Let us pray that the Lord continues to stir up our brothers and sisters with a fervent concern for missions.

E. Toronto Alliance Church (TAC) – Francis Lee

Under the pandemic, the past few years had proved to be challenging years for the TAC ministries. Nevertheless, praise the Lord! TAC Community Service continues to open and witness God's love to the less fortunate in Toronto by distributing lunch bags at their doorstep. Corporate worship service has been suspended and replaced with meaningful spiritual conversations with those who come for food bank and clothing services.

H. 2023 Mission Fund Budget

South Asian (Peace Network) Ministry Pastor Chan's couple

Thank God! In 2023, there was a new breakthrough in South Asian Ministry. In addition to the general large-scale celebration events (a total of 3 times, an average of 23 people), we added a treasure hunt - Discovery Bible Study. In the past year, there were 5 Bible studies (average 7-8 people):

March:	"The First Sin" (Man and Woman Eat the Fruit) – Genesis 3:1-13
May:	"Jesus is the Son of God" (Jesus and the Religious Leader) – John 3:1-18
August:	"Jesus and the Man with Evil Spirits" – Mark 5:1-20
September:	"Jesus raises a Man from the Dead" – John 11:1-44
November:	"Jesus is Crucified" – Luke 23:32-56

These are controversial topics for the Muslims. Thanks to the Lord for His protection, we had good conversation every time. Some Muslims even explained to Hindus that Jesus is a great teacher (guru) because He is the Son of God, and another Muslim said, "Among the many prophets, only Jesus has the power to raise people from the dead." Pray that the Lord will continue to work in the hearts of these South Asian friends so that they will follow the Lord. In addition, we also used five-color beads to lead a South Asian lady to the faith in the Lord. This was all the work of the Holy Spirit.

At the Christmas celebration that just passed, a total of 36 South Asian friends attended. A Muslim convert to Christianity gave a testimony of salvation. A group of converts from an Indian church performed. Some brothers and sisters from other churches assisted in the program. What a picture of the Kingdom's vision!

Changing Meeting place

By the end of 2022, the average attendance of Daniel Fellowship has reached more than 30 people, and the meal before the fellowship has become a regular thing. To cope with the continuous growth in the number of people, starting in January 2023, Daniel Fellowship moved to the cafeteria in the New Wing. Thanks to the help of Michael Lam, we were able to set up a sound system in the cafeteria using the audio-visual equipment there for projection and allow us to set up a worship service for Daniel Fellowship. The cafeteria can also be turned into a mobile dining hall due to the convenience of a small kitchen and folding tables and chairs. I would also like to thank the predecessors for designing the cafeteria into a place with a network feel, so that the new generation of young people can build their world in this contemporary and spacious place, giving us room to develop.

Key Group Development

At the end of 2022, we established 3 groups, namely the "La La La Group" led by Elder Sam Kwan, the "Sound Level Group" led by Pastor Percy Ho, and the "Wendy Group" led by Pastor Wendy Kong. The number of people increased sharply in December, and as we were pondering to start a 4th group, Yvonne Chiu and Luke Tong joined the service team, allowing us to establish the 4th group called "No Car". The team members of this "No Car Group" gradually took shape under the careful care and guidance of Yvonne and Luke. In mid-2023, we discovered that friends without a foundation of faith were placed in the same group as believers, and there was a phenomenon of focusing on one and neglecting the other. Under the leadership of Pastor Percy Ho, a new "SUN Group" was started for the seekers of the Gospel.

In 2023, we focus on developing the relationship and personal growth of group members. Each group plans their own activity at each quarter. In the summer, each group has life camp according to the needs and characteristics of their group members. A total of 55 people participated, 17 of whom were non-believers. We have 5 groups, with an average of 50-70 people attending each week's activities.

Integration of Pastoral Care and Outreach

Daniel Fellowship is not only a place to shepherd young brothers and sisters, but also a community that attracts young people from Hong Kong (Stream A & B) who are non-believers in the Lord. In mid-year, the ratio of believers to non-believers reached 1:3. In view of this, our weekly meetings focus on fun activities and sharing of our faith. In addition to Bible studies and special topics every month, we study the book, "The Purpose-Driven Life", and believers are invited to share their faith experiences. It is called the "Coffee Shop VIP Corner" with guest speakers: Rev. Matthew Chiu, Rev. Stanley and Rosa Leung, Rev. Jones and Mrs. Lee, Pastor Justin Hsu, Luke Tong, etc.

I would also like to thank Pastor Percy Ho for setting up a self-financed "Star Canteen" with 3 dishes and 1 soup every Friday, except during the summer vacation, to live out "Gospel and bread", so that young people without family in this city can have food with the feel of home. We can see that pastoral care and outreach are inseparable in Daniel Fellowship.

"All in" Service

The Committee of 2023 discussed the direction and strategy of the overall ministry. Thanks to Binken Li, Curtis Tse, Frankie Yau, Amos Wong, Katy Cheung, Emi Wei, Lorraine Wong, Jimmy Wong and Joshua Law for their dedication.

Due to the rapid growth of Daniel Fellowship in just one year, we do not have enough people to serve. In the past year, thanks to the committee members composed of young people, and the addition of Michael Lam, Yvonne Chiu and Luke Tong, we were fortunate enough to have Rev. Daniel Wong, Pullisa Kong and Richard So to help with giving rides to the young people living in Scarborough to come to fellowship.

In addition, we have established a Daniel worship team. There is a 15-minute worship time before each meeting, using piano, guitar and cajon to worship God. At the beginning of this year, for the first time, we led all the brothers and sisters in the church to worship God during worship. Each group also raises coordinators and Bible Pilots among Christians to lead group members to discuss issues and study scriptures. Each group invites believers who attend regularly to establish a core and discuss group development with the elders and pastors. Due to the expansion of the ministry team, a total of 19 people participated in this year's three-day and two-night ministry retreat.

Discipleship Training

After Sunday worship, 11:15 am to 12:30 pm is the training time for senior believers. There is discipleship training on the 1st and 3rd Sundays, and a prayer meeting on the 5th Sunday. It is for the development of the ministry and the future of the fellowship. We pray for the non-believers and world affairs. The average attendance is about 20. Pastor Percy Ho led these training. The topics studied in 2023 included: Understanding SCAC, Struggling with Bible reading, Doubts in prayer, and Re-understanding various Christian values.
