

Rev. Stanley Leung, Senior Pastor

“So then, men ought to regard us as servants of Christ and as those entrusted with the secret things of God.” (1 Corinthians 4:1-2) As servants of the Lord Jesus, His requirement for us is faithfulness, not success, not impressive reports and figures. Just as Paul reminded the Corinthian believers, all we can do is plant and water; growth and bearing fruit are God’s work. Therefore, any fruit is due to the Lord Jesus’ planning and arrangement, not something that humans can pile up and integrate, nor something anyone can boast about. Our unwavering attitude is faithfulness to the Lord, to the tasks He has entrusted to us, and to the gifts and opportunities He has given us. Ultimately, what we pursue and focus on is the Lord’s evaluation of us, not human praise.

This year’s church theme is “Be Holy”, and Christ, the sanctifying Lord, is one of the fourfold Gospels of the Christian and Missionary Alliance Church. *“Be holy, because I am holy.”* (1 Peter 1:16) A holy God calls us apart from the world to become saints. Having this identity, we must maintain holiness in our lives and conduct to match it. The pursuit of holiness is also a continuation of last year’s theme, *“Preparing for the Lord’s Second Coming”*. As John described, *“When he appears, we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is. Everyone who has this hope in him purifies himself, just as he is pure.”* (1 John 3:2b-3) We must prepare ourselves like a bride, adorned in holiness, and greet the Bridegroom with excitement. The pursuit of holiness is not an option, but a constant state we must maintain.

To align with our vision and core values—advocating Christ as the head of the family—this year we have launched Family Ministry, hoping to cultivate disciples who love God and neighbour and are based on biblical teachings. Elder Serena Lau and several pastors organized a ministry committee to plan how to help church families in this regard. They started by posting parenting and support materials on the church website, and also prepared various thematic workshops and camps. We understand that helping children grow in faith cannot rely solely on 2 to 3 hours of learning in church each week; parents also need to continue guiding them at home and setting a good example. This is crucial, and the goal of Family Ministry is to provide support to parents in this area.

This year, the English-speaking congregation celebrates its 10th anniversary, and we give thanks for its past development. Each year, we have an average of about 15 children joining our English-speaking congregation from Children’s Ministry. Despite this continuous expansion and a shortage of manpower, the pastors and leaders of the English Ministry continue to work diligently, upholding their mission, nurturing these spiritual seedlings, and helping them grow in faith, playing the roles of parents and companions. We are grateful for their wholehearted dedication and sacrifice. To address the challenges of a rapidly growing English-speaking congregation, Pastor Jonathan Choy was reassigned from Gormley Campus (GMC) to the Main Campus in September to assist with pastoral care for Youth Ministry. Once the GMC finds a full-time English-speaking pastor, he will remain at the Main Campus to pastor the English-speaking congregation.



Last year, we completed a structural reorganization of the GMC, aiming to share resources while giving brothers and sisters of GMC more freedom to develop evangelistic and pastoral work according to their circumstances and needs. This year, the Board of Elders (BOE) also decided to continue the relationship with GMC as a multi-site church. We are grateful for the growth in the number of people at GMC, but at the same time, we face the challenge of insufficient parking spaces. Church leaders have been seeking different solutions, including adding another worship service, renting or purchasing nearby land, etc. We await the Lord's preparation and hope that He will open a way for us according to His time. Regarding personnel changes at GMC, Rev. Stephan Lee retired this October, ending his many years of full-time ministry at the church. 11 years ago, he began ministry at GMC with a group of very dedicated brothers and sisters. For many years, he and his wife have worked tirelessly, shepherding and caring for brothers and sisters, and tirelessly spreading the Gospel. Their dedication and sacrifice are a fine example for all of us. We thank God for His timely arrangement and preparation. After Rev. Lee's retirement, Rev. Albert Chu responded to God's prompting and took on the leadership role of pastor at GMC. Rev. Chu and his wife quickly immersed themselves in the pastoral ministry of GMC. Through various meetings and visits, they listened to and understood the voices of brothers and sisters, understood the needs and challenges of the church, and began to lead the leaders forward. In view of the development of the community surrounding GMC, the need to shepherd the next generation, and the reassignment of Pastor Jonathan Choy, BOE decided to hire a full-time English-speaking pastor to address these needs and changes. In addition, this May we appointed Pastor Jacky Lam as the assistant pastor. He immigrated from Hong Kong to Toronto, Canada, and was later called by God to study at the seminary. He served as a theological intern at GMC. Pastor Lam will focus on pastoral work at the GMC and the development of Youth Ministry.

Regarding other staff changes, this February, Rev. Jones Lee resigned from his position and assumed the role of General Administrator at Showers of Blessing Evangelistic Ministry (SOBEM). We give thanks for Rev. Lee's pastoral care and companionship among us over the past 13 years. This May, Rev. Steven Folts joined our pastoral team as assistant pastor after a selection process. Rev. Folts will primarily assist in the pastoral work of the Main Campus.

Next year will be the church's 45th anniversary. We have formed a committee for this special occasion to plan and arrange a series of activities and gatherings next year, to reflect on the work of the Lord Jesus among us, and to continue working together for the Gospel.

Jesus Christ is the Lord of the church, the Bridegroom we await His return. Let us continue to sow and cultivate in our communities, clothe ourselves in holiness, and prepare ourselves in body, mind, and spirit so that when He returns we may receive praise for goodness and faithfulness!

2025 marked 10 years since the relaunch of the English Ministry (EM) at SCAC. It is remarkable to think that 10 years ago, in September of 2015, English worship services were held in U100 alone and was attended by approximately 25-30 – mainly youth. Fast forward to 2025, the Sunday English worship service attendance averaged 184 across the 12 months of 2025. Praise the Lord! Indeed, as always, there is much to be thankful for! I am grateful for the pastoral team that we have at SCAC which, in addition to myself, includes Rev. Rosa Leung, Rev. Chris Perumalla (Gormley EM), and Pastor Jonathan Choy (Gormley EM) – and also Jeremy Lo, our Main Campus Youth Ministry worker. The staff are supported by our English Congregation elders: Gary Lo and Joyce Cheung (Main Campus EM) and Bill Etzkorn and Serena Lau (Gormley EM). We also had Derek So who once again served as a deacon for the Main Campus EM. The EM Steering Committee in 2025 included Cynthia Ho, Jonathan Lau and Gabriel Tse – who served alongside the EM pastors, elders and deacons to provide oversight and vision for the EM congregation.

For 2025, both Campuses continued to partner together for the Sunday preaching series, with the EM pastors from both sites taking part in a rotation where each pastor preached at both sites on their scheduled Sundays. This year, the EM sermon series followed the overall church theme: “Be Holy”. Sermon series in 2024 included: “Same God, New You” (January, Main Campus only), “Holy Encounters: Old Testament” (February), “Holy Living” (March-May), SCAC Evangelism Month (June), “Holy Encounters: New Testament” (July-August), “Holy Calling” (September), SCAC Missions Month (October), “Be Holy – Year in Review” (November), “Why Jesus Came” (December). June’s Evangelism month saw Dr. Vince Vitale return again as a special speaker. This year, he was joined by his wife (via Zoom), Dr. Jo Vitale – and they both spoke at a half-day conference, titled, “Suffering & Sexism: Is God To Blame?”. 2025 also saw the continuation of our partnership with Children’s Ministry to host 2 BigFam Worship services – on March 30 and November 30 – where the entire church family, from the youngest to the most seasoned, could worship the Lord together. Baptisms in 2025 remained strong. There were 3 baptism services held this year: Easter (April 20) when 9 brothers & sisters were baptized; Summer (July 27) when 5 were baptized; and Christmas (December 21) when 4 were baptized. In addition to the Main Campus EM baptisms, 2025 also saw 2 from the Gormley EM baptized as well.

In our life group ministries, EM continued to have 3 main groups/fellowships in 2025: Joseph Fellowship (grades 7-12), C3 (university/college & young adult) and Couples Group (dating, engaged & married couples). For more details regarding Joseph and C3, please refer to their individual reports. The C3 Committee this year included 7 individuals from the EM congregation: Gabriel Tse (Chair), Flora Chan, Samantha Hung, Adrianna Mo, Matthias Ng, Abigail Poon and Isaac Yeung. C3 held their annual retreat, May 23-25 at Fair Havens Retreat & Conference Centre. The theme this year was “Faith That Overcomes”, where our guest speaker, Dr. Logan Gates, led the group of 60 through a study of “1 John”. Joseph Fellowship held their annual retreat, December 26-28, also at Fair Havens. This year, Pastor Stephen Chan was the



speaker and the theme was “Kingdom of God”. The EM Couples group met on the 1st Saturday of each month and continued to have a consistent attendance of 6-8+ couples each month. In 2025, the group did a book study based on the book, “The Lies Couples Believe: How Living the Truth Transforms Your Marriage” and then began a new series in September on “Spiritual Disciplines” which will carry over into 2026.

EM’s Sunday School Ministry had 3 classes in 2025: Grades 7 and 8, High School (Grades 9-12) and adult. In the adult class, notable teaching series included: “Emotionally Healthy Spirituality & Listening Prayer”, “A Biblical Response to the Role of Women”, “A Biblical Response to Calvinism”, and “Spiritual Disciplines”.

2025 also included some additional groups/ministries: for this year’s CCSA Softball Season, EM added another senior team for a total of 3 teams: SCAC Envision (Sr, new), SCAC Encounter (Sr) and SCAC Convergence (Jr). During the summer months, we recognized that there was a desire to go deeper with the Word of God and so, a summer Bible study group was formed which met once a month from June to August to study the book of “1 Corinthians”. This group was led by Rev. Rosa Leung. September also saw EM prayer meetings develop as the Main and Gormley Campuses decided to separate their Wednesday Zoom prayer meeting time, with the Main Campus prayer meetings returning to being in person, every Wednesday, beginning at 7:30pm. Finally, December of 2025 also saw the conclusion of our Rec Night sports ministry (Wednesday evenings, 8pm-10pm).

As I mentioned, 2025 was EM’s 10th anniversary and as such, we held a special celebration on August 22. This even included sharing from current and former EM congregants, as well as special guests – our former Senior Pastor, Rev. Matthew Chiu and former SCAC Pastor, Rev. Jones Lee. The theme for this event was, “For His Glory” where we wanted to emphasized that all of the blessings bestowed upon our congregation is all for the Glory of God. As part of the 10th Anniversary, it was also announced that the space where EM holds its Sunday Services, U100 and U200, would undergo some renovations as well as A/V upgrades. These renovations and upgrades became a year-long project but was thankfully complete in December. The congregation was able to utilize the upgrades to the worship space for the first time on Sunday, December 21. Praise the Lord!

Other highlights from 2025 include:

Regular Mandarin Congregation Pastoral Responsibilities

- ❖ Under the supervision of the Senior Pastor, arranging the Mandarin pulpit ministry, coordinating and inviting guest speakers.



- ❖ Preached 16 times, including Sunday worship services and outreach evangelistic meetings.
- ❖ Taught 2 semesters of Sunday school – “Being Built Up Through Prayer” (March to May), “Spiritual Devotional Bible Reading” (June to August). Also focused on equipping and developing the Sunday school teaching team.
- ❖ Organized weekly prayer meetings, personally leading once a month, and invited missionaries to share during prayer gatherings.
- ❖ Participated regularly or periodically in the Mandarin Congregation’s 10 small groups.
- ❖ Provided pastoral care for brothers and sisters with physical, emotional, and spiritual needs.
- ❖ Mentored and equipped brothers and sisters with potential and a heart to serve, including Sunday school teachers, small group leaders, and outreach counselors.
- ❖ Coordinated and discussed ministry matters across 9 ministry departments.
- ❖ Led Mandarin co-worker committee meetings every 2 months.

First-Time Experiences Beyond Regular Ministries

- ❖ The 1st Mandarin Good Friday service, with co-workers invited to share on the “Last Seven Words of Christ”. Brothers and sisters participated wholeheartedly, confessing sins and repenting before the cross.
- ❖ For the first time, Mandarin Ministry leaders attended a spiritual retreat, where they were led by pastors to be still before God and receive grace through listening and prayers.
- ❖ I conducted premarital counseling for the first time and officiated and hosted a wedding. We thank the Lord that Mandarin Congregation members lovingly served as if marrying off their own daughter.
- ❖ A total of 8 couples (5 from the Aquila Fellowship Group) attended the “Loving Couples Retreat” organized by the Chinese Family for Christ (CFFC), strengthening both marriages and fellowship among members.
- ❖ After years of prayer, the Men’s Fellowship Group was finally established and now meets monthly.
- ❖ For the first time, a “Spiritual Devotional Bible Reading” Sunday school class was offered. Brothers and sisters immersed themselves in scripture and experienced what many described as “reading themselves into the Bible”.
- ❖ Over 6 months, the Mandarin Congregation prayer meetings were led using the Alliance’s “Spiritual Transformation” prayer guide.
- ❖ Around the Joint Mission Conference in August, International Workers were invited to share at prayer meetings and preach in our Sunday Service, giving brothers and sisters a face-to-face understanding and experience of missions. Several small groups adopted missionaries for ongoing care and prayer.
- ❖ 4 sisters participated in the Mandarin short-term mission trip to Mexico.
- ❖ Began preparations for the “Praying for the Next Generation” ministry, launching in January 2026.



- ❖ Began preparations for an ESL outreach ministry, scheduled to launch in February 2026.

A fellow pastor once said that pastoring is like a mother cooking meal for her children every day, laborious work, often without immediate visible results. Yet, through daily, faithful nurturing, the children gradually grow. This metaphor deeply resonates with pastoral ministry.

From July to October, the fellowship also actively visited sisters in need, offering care and support.

Zion Fellowship

Indeed, we are living in unprecedented times dominated by social media, information confusion, and AI's rapid development. Our world feels surreal, where truth and falsehood are becoming increasingly blurred and difficult to distinguish.

The Bible also warns us, "*There will be terrible times in the last days. People will be lovers of themselves, lovers of money, boastful, proud, abusive, disobedient to their parents, ungrateful, unholly, without love, unforgiving, slanderous, without self-control, brutal, not lovers of the good...*" (2 Timothy 3:1-3) and "*always learning but never able to come to a knowledge of the truth.*" (2 Timothy 3:7)

Furthermore, we can feel overwhelmed by the global news of natural and human-made disasters, and the increase in violence and insecurity. However, these things should not surprise us, as the Lord says, "*And you will hear of wars and rumors of wars. See that you are not alarmed, for this must take place, but the end is not yet. For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom, and there will be famines and earthquakes in various places.*" (Matthew 24:6-7)

As the church in general, and the English Ministry (EM) in particular, how are we to respond?

In EM, we labour to prepare and equip our youth and young adults to be Christ's disciples who can respond faithfully and biblically - with hope, grace, and courage - to the present historical and ideological challenges. We are aware that this can only happen when they have encountered and developed a personal relationship with the Lord Jesus through His Holy Spirit, and by God's grace.

Holy sex



These require time for individual conversations, sharing, and encouragement. Therefore, I continue to invite them to meet after each weekly worship service to pray together.



Family Fellowship

I continue to thank our leader, Quoc Truong, the committee, and every large, medium, and small group leader for their faithful service. I have noticed their continued eagerness to share the Gospel and their involvement in various church ministries; they are always a good example for me to learn from.

John Fellowship

This year, I become the pastor of John Fellowship. As a men's fellowship, it feels very warm and welcoming. Most of the brothers are elders who have witnessed my growth in this church. At this life stage, we continue to grow through Bible reading, studying God's word, and pursuing spiritual growth within this fellowship. This year, our committee consisted of Samantha Hung, Matthias Ng, Isaac Yeung, Flora Chan, Abigail Poon, and Adrianna Mo. As part of our ongoing effort to better connect with the rest of English Ministry and SCAC, we continue to work with our pastoral and elder/deacon to run and plan events and programs.

We have continued fostering our community and fellowship, meeting about 3 times a month. Our programming alternates between Bible studies, prayer meetings, and more casual



events like socials and dinners. On average we have around 30 participants, with a peak of 49 people. This year, we started a new Bible study series and are reading select Psalms from the Book of Psalms. We are learning how God uses beautiful things like poetry to describe his plan and majesty while also telling the Gospel story. We have also formed 6 discipleship groups, totalling about 40 people. Discipleship groups meet twice a month and do Bible study applications and community nights.

In May, C3 had its 2nd retreat at Fair Havens, this time with a total of 67 attendees. The theme this year was “Faith That Overcomes” with our guest speaker Dr. Logan Gates. Some of our other highlights include packing 5 boxes of hygiene kits and food snacks for Yonge Street Mission and our annual Christmas potluck.

Praise God for the successful launch of the discipleship groups and the continued work of the committee to lead and grow the fellowship. We continue to find more ways to reach out to the community and develop a stronger biblical culture. Pray that God will continue to be faithful and this ministry will continue to be fruitful in the upcoming year.



Children's Ministry Sampson Kwan

The Children's Ministry (CM) at SCAC serves children from Nursery (newborns to 2.5 years old) through Grade 6. Our regular programs aim to nurture children spiritually and help them grow in their relationship with God.

We offer Children's Worship every Sunday morning from 9:30 am to 11:00 am. Children then participate in either Children's Sunday School (from 11:15 am to 12:30 pm. on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of each month) or AWANA Children's Fellowship (on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of each month).

On average, 74 children attend Children's Worship, and 60 children attend Children's Sunday School or AWANA. In addition, approximately 15 babies are registered in the nursery, with weekly attendance fluctuating between 1 and 9 babies.

We are deeply thankful that God has provided many loving and faithful volunteers to care for and disciple our children. The following individuals serve as coordinators for our various ministry teams:

In addition to our dedicated adult volunteers, we are blessed to have 18 energetic youth volunteers serving as student leaders in AWANA. We pray that the Lord will richly bless all our volunteers for their faithful labor in Christ.

Beyond our regular Sunday programs, the Children's Ministry hosted and participated in various events throughout the year, including:

- ❖ BigFam Worship with the English Ministry (March, November)
- ❖ Children's Ministry Leaders' Retreat at the Gormley Campus (May)
- ❖ Summer Camp / Vacation Bible School (July, August)
- ❖ CM New School Year Opening Ceremony and Parents' Gathering (September)
- ❖ Toronto Children's Ministry Conference (November)
- ❖ AWANA Shoebox Drive and Christmas Celebration (November, December)

When compared with the previous school year, we observed the following trends:

- 1) An increasing number of children from newcomer families have limited or no knowledge of English. Pastor Stephen has visited these families to build



relationships and better understand their needs. CM volunteers have attempted to provide translation support during Children's Worship whenever possible. We are also working with the Mandarin Ministry team to explore ways to better serve these families so that they may feel welcomed and at home at SCAC.

- 2) There has been a decline in Sunday attendance. Compared with 2024, we observed approximately a 5% decrease in Children's Worship attendance and a 10% decrease in Children's Sunday School and AWANA attendance.

To promote the Children's Ministry, Elder Sampson Kwan shared information about our CM programs at the Active Adult outreach program, and Deacon Louis Hung also mentioned CM activities during a recent radio interview.

Looking ahead, the CM team is planning events such as an AWANA Bowling Day and a Fall Carnival to reach out to families with young children in our neighbourhood. We are also considering expanding the summer VBS program to include children in Grades 1 and 2, in hopes of welcoming more children to participate in our summer programs. In addition, an "Outreach Strategies Task Force" has been established to study current trends and develop strategies to share the Good News with children and families in the wider community.

We pray that the Lord will grant us wisdom and discernment as we continue to serve the children in our church family and reach out to children and families in our community with the Good News of our Lord Jesus Christ in 2026.

We give thanks to God for His guidance, since October, I have been entrusted by the church to serve as the Site Pastor of the Gormley Campus. Though I take on this responsibility with humility and reverence, I firmly believe that serving the Lord itself is a grace. May we rely

Children’s Ministry (Gormley Campus) Rev. Amy Wong

2025 has been an exciting year for the Children’s Ministry. At the beginning of the year, we tried out the AWANA cubbies program with our early childhood kids but because it was too hard for both the children and the teachers to teach 2 separate lessons. So, we decided to try something different in September 2025, when we split the same lesson into 2 parts. Now, the early childhood program has a good mix of arts and crafts, Bible teaching, singing, puppet shows and games to keep the children interested in the Bible learning.



For the Junior class, we are starting to encourage the children to read the Bible during class. We want to encourage the younger children to develop Bible reading skills at an early age so when they grow older, they will be able to find books and content in the Bible easily.

And for the Senior class, we encourage them to memorize God's word and discuss what they are learning from the lesson in class time so they can apply it to their lives.

For AWANA, we decided to change the format a little bit to be less handbook based, to be more topical in nature. In Truth and Training, we now have a different topic every week that will help them grow in their faith such as answering questions about God, developing spiritual disciplines like Bible reading and prayer and even watching episodes of "What's in the Bible?"

With the addition of some of our youth helpers in September 2025, they have added a younger vibe to our AWANA ministry and are good role models to the children. We have also given the older AWANA students a devotional book, to take home so they can get in the habit of daily devotion on their own.

In July 2025, rather than running a sports camp like in the last 2 years, we ran a cooking camp instead. To our surprise, it was a great success, and the children enjoyed it very much! In 2026, we hope to run a 2-week cooking camp to see how it will go. Thank God for all the adult and youth helpers that helped make this cooking camp a success!

And on December 24, we will end our year by worshiping God together in the Cantonese service as a church family.

I thank God for every volunteer who teach and serve the children in 2025! May God continue to give you what you need to pour into the next generation of children at Gormley.

Overview of Ministry Vision

In 2025, the Evangelism and Follow-up Ministry at the Gormley Campus successfully integrated its operations to create a seamless journey for seekers—from initial outreach to post-conversion discipleship. Our mission remains focused on the Great Commission of Jesus Christ: *“...Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you...”* (Matthew 28:19-20). Through community engagement, systematic Gospel sharing, and spiritual upbringing and cultivation, we continually expand God’s Kingdom.

Outreach Ministry

- ❖ Basketball Outreach: A new season kicked off in August with a BBQ, successfully recruiting new members and engaging non-believer parents. 5 matches were held in the fall at the Main Campus, using sports to build youth character and share the Gospel with families.
- ❖ Fishing Outreach: Held in July in partnership with Emmanuel and Faith-Hope-Love (FHL) Fellowships. Over 10 newcomers expressed interest in future events, establishing a strong initial connection with the community.



Evangelism & Training

- ❖ Music Evangelistic Meeting: Held on May 10, resulting in 2 decisions for Christ. The event also strengthened the sense of unity and belonging among brothers and sisters at the Gormley Campus.

Youth Ministry (Gormley Campus) Jacky Lam**Raising Up a New Generation of Youth Disciples to Become Servant Leaders**

Over the past year, the Youth Fellowship has focused on nurturing young people to become disciples of the Lord. We are delighted that 3 young people were baptized in March and December and bravely shared their testimonies before others—a truly heartwarming achievement.

 - On January 11, 2026 we will begin adult Sunday school on Sundays from 10 to 11 am. Lenny Hon will lead us through a study of the Book of Isaiah.
- ❖ Christmas Mini-Festival of Light and Joy
 - We ended our year with a Christmas outreach event. This year we tried something new by hosting a Mini-Festival of Light and Joy where we invited our community to enjoy lights set up at church and festivities inside. May this beautiful testimony practice in our lives, become seeds of the Gospel spreading among our communities. Glory to God! “... As the Father has sent me, I am sending you.” (John 20:21)

We can understand this verse to read: “As the Father sent me, so also in the same way I am sending you.” The Father loved and listened to the Son. The Son loved and watched for what the Father initiated. Jesus, in dynamic nearness to the Father, continued what God had been doing throughout history. Jesus sends us in this same way. Our 2026 mission fund budget is \$962,100. We pray that brothers and sisters will continue to tithe faithfully, support missions, and fulfill the Great Commission together with our international workers.

Family Ministry Serena Lau

Family Ministry is a new ministry at SCAC with its official launch dated back in April this year. One of our church's core values is to promote Christ as the Head of the household. It is our goal that the church partners with families to nurture disciples who love God, love others, and who are grounded in biblical teaching. Our committee members are Rev. A survey was conducted...

In order to better serve brothers and sisters in different types of family composition, a survey was put out to collect information to help set ministry directions. With options to choose from, the main questions asked were (1) What areas of family life do you feel need the most support? (2) What types of activities would you like to see in Family Ministry? (3) What challenges do you currently face in balancing faith and family life?

A webpage has been set up...

We reckon that resources made available for each member within a family would be helpful. Therefore, a Family Ministry webpage was created for families providing useful links on marriage, parenting, for adults, youths, and children, together with contents such as prayers and devotional materials as a start.

A Response addressing survey results...

One of the responses to the survey question "What challenges do you currently face in balancing faith and family life" was struggles with communication with family members. By God's providence, Dr. Christine Lau, associate professor of Counseling at Alliance Bible Seminary in Hong Kong, came to offer insights and advice through a workshop held on August 9 titled "After You Have Become An Adult: The Tension and Growth Between An Individual and One's Family".

An Effort to Equip Parents...

A resource for discipling teens on biblical sexuality has been acquired from "The Holy Sexuality Project" exploring topics like identity, temptations, desires, singleness, marriage, gender, and more. From September to November, parents learned in Sunday school format how to start conversation on the topic of sexuality with their teenagers.

A look into 2026 ...

From the survey, the top 4 areas of family life participants felt need the most support include health & wellness, spiritual growth for families, youth/teen guidance, and marriage enrichment. In view of this data, a Marriage Enrichment Retreat (April) and Sunday school on parenting (March – May) have been planned for 2026.

Existing Ministries

- ❖ **Worship Support:** Support weekly worship AV and YouTube live streaming for worship services for the Cantonese, Mandarin, and English ministries, ensuring stable and reliable broadcasts.
- ❖ **Sermon Record Management:** Manage the weekly backup of worship videos from the SCAC YouTube channel to secure digital storage. Extract, process, publish, and archive sermon audio on both the SCAC internal database and the public website.
- ❖ **E-Bulletin:** Provide weekly on-site E-Bulletin updates, including a Cantonese video bulletin digest displayed on lobby TVs to keep the congregation informed.
- ❖ **Special Event Support (Interpretation and Translation Services, Streaming, Recording):** Set up and operate wireless headset for ITS systems during joint worship services. Provide streaming and recording support for major church events, including Easter and Christmas worship services.
- ❖ **Miscellaneous Video Project Support:** Produce, edit, and translate video content as requested by the church office, pastors, and ministry leaders. Examples



include Mission Moments, baptism testimony videos, and Christmas Shoebox promotion videos.

- ❖ **Technical Support and Campus Display Management:** Provide first-line diagnosis and repair for AV and electronic hardware. Track changes to the church's AV systems and new-wing lighting systems, and plan appropriate maintenance strategies. Design and construct portable AV carts for G200 video streaming and gymnasium AV services. Maintain the Main Campus internal video casting network.



Active Adult Ministry Louis Hung

The Active Adult Ministry is a Gospel-centered outreach initiative dedicated to sharing Jesus' Good News with community members who do not yet know the Lord. The ministry engages people through a variety of activities—such as smartphone and technology workshops, home safety sessions, health seminars, and practical life classes. With a warm and friendly learning atmosphere, the ministry has attracted many participants from the community.

Co-workers serve with hearts of care and companionship, building genuine friendships and long-lasting relationships while gradually sharing the message of the Gospel. Through Alpha Courses and Evangelism Explosion (EE) visitations, participants are encouraged to know and accept Jesus Christ as their Savior and become children of God. In addition, the ministry uses thematic discussions and cozy tea gatherings as bridges of communication, enabling participants to connect, share, and grow in love, forming a fellowship centered on Christ.

In 2025, we welcomed 198 new friends, and the weekly average attendance for all activities was about 100 people, indicating stable participation and an ever-growing connection with the community. Among the attendees, about 40% are non-believers. The Active Adult Ministry operates in 2 parts every Thursdays: from 12:30 to 1:30 pm: a "Relaxed Tea Time" offering various classes or activities such as line dancing, crafts, and health exercises; from 1:30 to 3:00 pm is the "Special Topic Lecture" period.

A major highlight of 2025, starting in June, is the new "Casual Chatting Station" introduced during the same midday "Relaxed Tea Time". This interactive group uses everyday life topics as a starting point, gradually moving into sharing life experiences and emotions through relaxed, natural conversation, ultimately leading to the Gospel message. The progression typically unfolds in 3 gentle stages: (1) building trust and comfort through friendly discussion of familiar issues such as family, hobbies, or current events; (2) deepening the connection by exploring personal stories, challenges, and life values in an open and supportive atmosphere; (3) naturally bridging these reflections to spiritual truths, introducing God's love and the hope found in Jesus Christ. This natural and warm form of interaction helps participants connect deeply with one another and prepares open hearts for the Gospel.

Looking ahead to next year, the ministry will continue running Alpha Courses in Spring and arrange EE visitations, helping community friends know and receive the Gospel. Additionally, after completing the Alpha Course, we plan to establish discipleship small groups to accompany new believers and seekers on their spiritual journeys. Through these groups, more people will be nurtured in faith, experience God's love, and come to know the truth of the Gospel and accept salvation.

Community Outreach Team Jeany Chan

Thank God for leading the community outreach team to give personal testimony in various Chinese shopping malls on the 4th Saturday of every month. This year a total of 127 people were contacted, of which we shared the complete Gospel message with 74, and 2 responded to the invitation to Christ.

We visited 600 households during the “Jesus Loves Midland” community outreach in June, and followed up 50 households in July and August, and they were grateful for our care, and we prayed with them for their needs.

In December, we were grateful to have 30 brothers and sisters visited 84 stores, and secured permission from 24 stores to hold Christmas caroling on December 20 at their stores. 58 brothers and sisters attended the caroling and sharing our personal testimony and Gospel message with the store owners and staff. May our Heavenly Father continue to move more brothers and sisters to participate in this ministry, stepping out of their comfort zones, and take action to care for their neighbours.

Alpha Course Francis Ching

Alpha Course was held from September 13 to December 6, 2025, every Saturday morning at 9:30 am. 2 participants were enrolled, and one successfully graduated. One of the participants attended Sunday worship, while the other expressed a desire to attend church services, but this was pending due to transportation issues. The Telecare Ministry was launched in 2020 during the pandemic. It aimed to maintain spiritual connections and provide prayer support when physical gatherings were suspended. As in-person worship resumed, voicemail demand declined, and the team naturally scaled down.

Hot-line Service Activity Overview:

- ❖ 2024: 10 messages received, mostly external inquiries and prayer requests.
- ❖ 2025: Only 2 messages recorded:
 - January: External inquiries about children's day camp and summer Bible class.
 - November: Sister M requested prayer for her daughter under academic stress. Immediate prayer was offered, and the dormant WhatsApp prayer group was reactivated, mobilising 13 members. Rev. Steven Folts attempted contact, but left message only. Two days later, I made a follow-up call and left text message. Sister M texted me about her daughter's recent exam results and expressed gratitude. Her reply encouraged the team and renewing connections.

Ongoing Connections:

- ❖ Daily Bread Links: Shared with members unable to attend church, sustaining spiritual discipline.
- ❖ Livestream Worship Links:
 - After 2 years' COVID Zoom YouTube Live Service, Sister N continues to receive weekly YouTube links for over 2 years, maintaining care connect despite barriers.
 - Three other members also receive links regularly, expressing that this connection prevents discouragement during individual visits.

Impact:

Though operating at reduced capacity, Telecare remains a vital ministry. Through prayer and compassion, it enables believers to experience God's love and presence. Glory to His name.

“So Teens” Fellowship Curtis Tse

“So Teens” is a group of youth from recent immigrant families from Hong Kong, primarily Cantonese-speaking and rooted in Hong Kong culture, who are shepherded by Pastor Wendy Kong. The committee members include Curtis Tse, Emily Cheng, Anna Mo, Timothy Wong (second half of the year), and Enoch Lo (first half of the year). We would also like to extend special thanks to our ministry partners, including guest instructor Philip Cheng, who served as a guest teacher; Pastor Percy Ho for providing Bible study materials and support; and Elder Sampson & Hazel Kwan for resourcing the “So Teens” camp.

“So Teens” was established for recent Hong Kong teen immigrants who find it difficult to integrate into Canadian-born Chinese (CBC) youth culture, to help them build spiritual friendships in their new environment. After successfully fostering bonds within the community last year, this year we focused on promoting Bible learning and real-life application, equipping youth to live upon a solid biblical foundation.

As attendance and engagement among “So Teens” participants continue to stabilize, the committee has introduced a more structured schedule of weekly programs, including monthly Bible studies, sharing, and board games. Each gathering begins with worship and short games led by youth as a “warm-up” before diving into spiritual learning.

This year’s Bible study themes include Gospel-focused inductive studies to help youth understand the Gospel of Jesus Christ holistically, and an in-depth study of “Genesis 1” to



respond to the youth's questions and interest in God's creation of the heavens and the earth. The goal of the Gospel studies is to help teens gain a complete understanding of the true meaning of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

This year's "So Teens" camp, named "So Chill", was held at the end of summer vacation, aiming to help youth relieve academic stress and learn healthy, biblical ways to face and process pressure. In addition to pastors and committee members, we invited several youth to participate in the planning of camp activities and Sunday worship service, providing them with opportunities to serve God while learning to collaborate with brothers and sisters from different backgrounds.



The following attendance statistics reflect the number of youth participants this year, excluding pastors and committee members:

- ❖ Regular weekly meetings 16 (average)
- ❖ "So Chill" camp 15

The new committee will continue to focus on biblical teaching, further equipping youth to become committed disciples of Christ. During this formative season of shaping lifelong values, we pray they will be deeply rooted in God's Word, walking faithfully with God in unwavering confidence no matter what challenges they face.



Daniel Fellowship Wendy Kong

With the Hong Kong Pathway Stream A/B program, Daniel Fellowship has seen a surge in young people from Hong Kong. The constant inflow of people has finally stabilized in 2025. The committee consists of 3 young people: Anna Mo, Sam Lin, and Stanley Lam. In 2025, we studied the Book of Ephesians monthly, learning about unity in Christ. In order to develop a diverse fellowship life with increased connections between believers and non-believers, the committee has established 4 core groups: Sports Group, Board Game Group, Spiritual Building Group, and Outdoor Activities Group.

Daniel Fellowship Plan

- ❖ Personal Development: training young people who can serve, acquiring coordination skills, understanding of the Christian faith, establishing roots in Canada.
- ❖ Group Development: improving worship atmosphere, fostering a spiritual atmosphere, building small group relationships, promoting diverse fellowship formats, creating opportunities for cross-group interaction.
- ❖ Internal Management: managing food expenses, sustainable development, establishing a succession mechanism, strengthening communication between pastors and committee members, establishing a stable fellowship schedule, improving leaders' understanding of the group's needs.
- ❖ Outreach: providing open registration for events.

1. Outreach and Recruiting New Friends

The 4 core groups are the fellowship's main external channels. Through organizing open activities (such as sports, games, BBQs, etc.), we attract new friends and non-Christians to join the fellowship, keeping the fellowship open and capable of growth.

2. Fostering Cross-Group Communication

The 4 core groups offer various activities, allowing brothers and sisters from different cell groups, as well as non-believers, to collaborate and build community relationships.

3. Providing a Platform for Ministry and Developing New Leaders

Through the establishment of each core group, brothers and sisters have the opportunity to try coordinating activities, training ministry personnel, and building stable teams and leaders.


4. The Soul Group for Spiritual Building

The fellowship's goals are to study God's Word, pray for closeness to God, and care for missionaries. To promote spiritual growth, the fellowship sends "Our Daily Bread" to members electronically. Brothers and sisters also regularly participate in various church ministries and prayer meetings. Theme for 2025 is: "Be Holy and Useful to the Lord".

The fellowship has approximately 400 members, divided into 30 small groups, and an additional "Chatting and Sharing" evangelistic group to support seekers. Tuesday dance classes and Friday sports days serve as outreach activities to lead people to Christ.

Each small group has a group leader and assistant group leader who care for the group members, with an average of 8 to 15 people per group. Every 3-5 small groups are led and managed by a mid-group leader who oversees and promotes evangelistic outreach programs and liaises with the committee members to deliver messages. Every 2 mid-groups are cared for and visited by a large group leader who prepares for the quarterly large group meetings and promotes the work to the mid and small groups in accordance with the fellowship's vision. The group leader prays constantly to seek the vision given by the Holy Spirit, coordinates and promotes the entire family fellowship's work, and works in unity with the church to carry out evangelistic work and promote the spiritual growth of group members.

The executive administrator records all fellowship meetings and activities. The counselors, in addition to leading the group leaders in monthly Bible study, pastoring group members, and supporting the committee members, also frequently visit and comfort group members.
